

**The Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky**  
**Stated Meeting Minutes**  
**May 12, 2025, 1:00 p.m.**  
**Cedar Ridge Camp, 4010 Routt Road, Louisville KY 40299**

The meeting was opened with prayer by the moderator, Elder Alicia Bloos. First-time members, commissioners, and guests were welcomed.

There were no corresponding members to seat.

Rev. KT Ockels, president of the Cedar Ridge Camp board of directors welcomed the presbytery to Cedar Ridge Camp. This was the first time that the presbytery met in the new Calvin Chapel at Cedar Ridge Camp. KT thanked Elder Ben Blake for creating and building the communion table and lectern for the new chapel.

There was a break.

The business meeting continued following worship.

**Consent Agenda:** Jerry Van Marter reviewed the consent agenda.

This included: approval of the minutes of the February 22nd meeting of presbytery.

Jerry also reported that there was an oversight at the previous presbytery meeting. During the Church Administration Committee report, there was an omission of constitutional amendment 24K. (Requires clerks to report any knowledge of sexual abuse to civil authorities.) Therefore, the amendment was included in the consent agenda.

The sated clerk moved the consent agenda. There was no discussion. The consent agenda was approved.

**Interim General Presbyter Report:** Rev. Dr. Marian McClure reported. Marian discussed the presbytery agenda in order to help members see the continuity of presbytery meetings and our connection to the Synod of Living Waters. She explained how the presbytery is related to the Synod. She stressed the importance of congregational participation in presbytery meetings.

**Report of the Synod Commissioners:** Rev. Brad Palmer and Elder Perry Chang reported on their experience attending the Synod meeting. Brad discussed the synod's support for education of pastors for small congregations. Perry shared that the meeting was very powerful because of the connections that he made traveling to and attending the meeting.

It was moved to receive the report from the Synod Commissioners. There was a second. The motion to receive the report was approved.

**Church Administration Committee:** Perry Chang, Committee Chair, reported.

On behalf of the Church Administration Committee Perry Chang moved that constitutional amendment 24-J be disapproved. (This amendment would change the General Assembly participation resulting in an increase in the number of General Assembly commissioners.)

There was discussion. The motion to disapprove amendment 24-J was approved.

On behalf of the Church Administration Committee, Ben Stewart moved that constitutional amendment 24-C be approved. (This amendment adds affirmation of diversity and inclusion principles in *the Book of Order* to the standards for ordination.)

There was discussion. The motion to approve amendment 24-C was approved.

**Coordinating Commission:** Rev. Christine Coy Fohr, chair, reported.

Christine reported that the Coordinating Commission has met twice since the February presbytery meeting.

On behalf of the commission Christine nominated Vince Patton to serve on the nominations committee. There were no nominations from the floor. The motion was approved.

Christine reported that the commission has reviewed the position description for the next General Presbyter. She reported that the commission had discussed various funding models for staffing. The commission will be organizing a team to consider this concurrent to the process of hiring a new General Presbyter.

Christine reported that currently there is not a standard presbytery meeting start time. The commission has proposed that the presbytery meeting generally be started between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. The Coordinating Commission will consider this over the next while.

- **Mission Committee:** Faye Fedlam reported. She reported that the Self Development of People Committee still has up to \$5,000 grants available. If anyone is interested, they may contact her. Nancy Leach reported on the Hygiene Kit preparation day will be Saturday September 20, 2025 at Beulah Presbyterian Church. She hopes many people will participate.

- **Finance Committee:** Tom Hughes reported. Tom shared the financial statements from the docket. He reported that it is too early to establish any trends in the budget. They have met to review their investments. They reviewed a grant to Beechmont Presbyterian Church for \$20,000. They continue to meet with Covenant Community Presbyterian Church regarding their financial needs.

- **Church Growth and Transformation Committee:** Bryce Wiebe reported on the work at Goodness Grows Goshen. He shared the story of storm damage at the Goodness Grows Goshen building. He talked about the plans for the campus, programs, and budget. They will work to be good stewards of the property and ministry.

- **Hispanic Latino Commission:** Rev. Tom Vandergriff reported. First, Tom thanked Cedar Ridge Camp for scholarships that help Hispanic youth to attend camp. Second, he shared that the committee continues to support the immigrant community during this difficult political time. He reported that the committee continues to seek ways to help folks who are in need in our community. He suggested that congregations consider preparing a document to use as guidance immigrant support. There are suggestions about security, cameras and “private” signs on rooms that are not accessible to the public. The committee has changed their flow for donations. There is a new QR code to help Preston Highway Ministries directly through the presbytery. However, the emergency fund should be funded through Fourth Presbyterian Church.

- **Christian Education Committee:** Rev. John Kuper, committee chair, reported. John shared information about the up-coming Triennium for youth and young adults. He invited interested folks to register by May 30th. It is hoped that the presbytery will be able to fund all participants.

- **UKirk:** Nell Herring reported. She shared about the work and mission of UKirk and invited congregations to participate in the mission. She thanked supporters. Nell read a testimony from a young adult that has been positively impacted by the ministry.

The vice-moderator took the chair.

**Announcements:** There was a period of one-minute announcements.

**Personnel Committee:** Betty Muse, chair, reported. On behalf of the committee, Betty presented the new General Presbyterian position description for approval. There was discussion. The motion was approved.

#### **POSITION DESCRIPTION MID-KENTUCKY PRESBYTERY**

**TITLE:** General Presbyterian  
**HOURS:** Full-Time  
**CALL TERM:** 5 Years (renewable)  
**ACCOUNTABILITY:** The general presbyter is accountable to the presbytery through the Personnel Committee.

**EVALUATION:** The Personnel Committee of Mid-Kentucky reviews this position annually with a comprehensive review beginning no later than June 15 of the fourth year of service.

**PURPOSE:** Mid-Kentucky Presbytery Vision Statement: *Spiritual leaders empowering life-giving congregations for the transformation of the world by faith in God through Jesus Christ.*

It is our hope that the General Presbyter will be both shepherd and visionary, providing care and support for congregations and leaders of the presbytery while with them discerning and responding to God’s call for the uniquely gifted Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky in these changing times and context.

#### **AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY:**

**Pastoral Care**

- Provide a pastoral presence for congregations and for teaching elders, fostering an environment where all may grow in their own spiritual journeys.
- Encourage and engage new and existing members of presbytery. Welcome new teaching elders into the life of the presbytery and support ruling elders who are newly elected to presbytery leadership.
- Provide nurture, support, and community building for those serving in validated ministries.
- Ensure the presbytery offers pastoral, reliable, and fair processes of support during times of crisis, conflict, and transition.

### **Vision and Strategy**

- Work with Presbytery Staff, Commissions and Committees to establish a clear, achievable, and compelling vision and strategy for the Mid Kentucky Presbytery.
- Help the presbytery gain the intercultural competencies and interfaith sensibilities needed to be the church in a diverse society.
- Foster an environment that encourages and acknowledges innovation in congregations and in the presbytery and in ecumenical, interfaith and community partnerships.
- Facilitate partnerships between congregations, between congregations and the presbytery, and between congregations and potential ecumenical and interfaith partners.

### **Leadership Support**

- Build relationships with congregations that enhance awareness of congregational life and fully utilize the gifts of teaching and ruling elders.
- Serve as a resource as needed or identified for presbytery commissions and committees, teaching and ruling elders, and congregations.
- Create and promote opportunities for leader development within the presbytery.
- Provide training opportunities and share in best practices for teaching and ruling elders, and congregations.

### **Connecting**

- Interpret the presbytery's mission and ministries to congregations and share knowledge of the work of the General Assembly and synod.
- Engage in dialogue with ecumenical and interfaith partners and with other organizations within the bounds of the presbytery that connect with Mid-Kentucky's mission and ministries including the Kentucky Council of Churches.
- Attend presbytery commissions, committees as assigned; network and relate to other presbytery entities upon request of the entities.
- Collaborate with the synod, general assembly agencies and entities, Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, other ecumenical and interfaith bodies, and organizations in covenant relationship with the presbytery (ex. Presbyterian Homes and Services, Bellewood and Brooklawn.)

### **Administration**

- Maintain and oversee the function of the presbytery office including finances.
- Function as head of staff and collegially supervise staff.
- Foster a staff team dedicated to serving congregations and common mission.
- Provide or ensure staff support to the presbytery's committees and commissions, and elected leaders.
- Collaborate closely with the moderator of the presbytery.

### **PERSONAL QUALITIES AND SKILLS**

- Must be a teaching elder or ruling elder in the PC(USA).
- Must have an undergraduate college degree; prefer a graduate degree in a field related to the practice of ministry.
- Prefer experience in mid-council ministry.
- Prefer training and experience in transitional ministry and in conflict management
- Must exhibit knowledge of and commitment to the Reformed tradition, and doctrine and polity of the PC(USA).
- Prefer demonstrated experience in adaptive organizational leadership.
- Must maintain a commitment to equity, inclusiveness, and diversity.
- Must recognize, nurture, and facilitate the gifts for the ministry of others.
- Must build trust and transparent communication.
- Must demonstrate basic knowledge of information technology and financial management.

- Must have multi-cultural experience.
- Must exhibit a good sense of humor.

### **Ministry Context**

The Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky is comprised of 45 congregations, three new worshipping communities (Goodness Grows, Spirit of Sophia, Preston Highway), and Camp Cedar Ridge. Three-quarters of the presbytery's congregations cannot afford called and installed pastoral leadership. Many of the presbytery's minister members serve in validated ministries, especially chaplaincy. The presbytery includes three sizable cities – Louisville, Frankfort (the state capital), and Elizabethtown. Roughly one-third of the presbytery's congregations are in or near one of those cities, with the remainder in either rural or small-town settings. The presbytery is also home to the several of the General Assembly agencies and the Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Also within the bounds of the presbytery is the University of Louisville, where the presbytery maintains a campus ministry (UKirk). Betty reported that the committee continues to work on reviewing presbytery position description and is revisiting the personal manual.

On behalf of the committee Betty also moved that the presbytery authorize the Coordinating Commission to approve the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) that will be developed by the search committee. Betty noted that Greg Goodwiller had recommended that we add a step to allow the Coordinating Commission to approve the MDP.

There was no discussion. The motion was approved.

**Commission on Ministry:** Marissa Galvin Vale, chair, reported.

The Commission on Ministry (COM) continues to provide vital support to congregations and ministers across the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky. The following summarizes our key activities and ongoing priorities from our March and April 2025 meetings.

### **1. Pastoral Transitions and Support**

- **Beulah Presbyterian Church:** COM approved Beulah Presbyterian Church's invitation to the Rev. José Luis Casal to serve as part-time pastor and approved the terms of call.

- **Portland Avenue Presbyterian Church:** COM granted the Rev. Whit Malone (member of Western North Carolina Presbytery) permission to labor within the bounds of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery so that he provides pastoral services to Portland Avenue Presbyterian Church.
- **Beechmont Presbyterian Church:** The COM approved renewed terms of call for Rev. Marissa Galván-Valle with Beechmont Presbyterian Church, affirming a continued and healthy pastoral relationship.
- **Briargate Presbyterian Church:** COM authorized Ruling Elder Kevin Kouba to serve as a Pastoral Resource Person at Briargate Presbyterian Church, with sacramental authority, pending his commissioning as a Commissioned Pastor. The COM and stated clerk will guide his preparation.
- **Anchorage Presbyterian Church:** Pending congregational action, the COM approved the dissolution of the pastoral relationship between Rev. John Kubar and the church, effective May 18, 2025.

## 2. Membership Transfer

- Approved the transfer of Rev. Sandra Moon to the Presbytery of the Cascades, effective May 1, 2025.
- Received the Rev. Liza Hendricks (HR) as a member of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery by transfer from the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia.

## 3. Shared Ministry Model Exploration

- Keenan Rodgers from the Board of Pensions presented the new *Shared Ministry* benefits model. This model provides dues subsidies for benefits when two or more congregations desire to work together to call full-time pastoral leadership. This approach could offer new pathways for smaller congregations to afford a pastor. COM members expressed interest in exploring this model further, potentially during a retreat or future COM meeting.

## 4. Resource Updates and Process Improvement

- COM approved the updated 2025 Temporary Pastor Agreement and a revised documents to guide meetings between sessions, PNCs, pastors and the COM. These resources streamline our support for churches in transition and clarify expectations during leadership changes.

## 5. Leadership Appreciation

- COM formally received and acted upon a request from Rev. John Stanger for release from the exercise of ordained ministry in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and agreed to send a letter expressing gratitude for his service.

## 6. Care of Church Professionals

- Ministers' Retreat is set for October 20, 2025 at Cedar Ridge.

## 7. Benefits Regional Summit

COM chair participated in the Benefits Regional Summit: Understanding the Value of the Benefits Plan, held in Chicago on April 7-8, 2025. These were the topics that were discussed:

- **A Theology of Benefits:** the scripture-based foundation of our work at the Board of Pensions also guides the course we chart
- **Living by the Gospel:** a guide to supporting ministers through the Board that details employer incentive programs and includes salary study information
- **Benefits Plan details:** guidance, information and resources for members to help them better understand and use their benefits
- **Dues packages:** eligibility, benefits and dues for the packages that can be offered to members
- **Ministry innovation:** the Board's investment in innovative ministry solutions and new forms and contexts as ideas surface from within the Church
- **Assistance Program:** need-based grants that embody our connectional Church at its best
- **Lifelong Learning:** educational programs for members of the Benefits Plan, their spouses and surviving spouses, employers, and seminarians.

This is a reminder of the *Assistance programs* that are available:

For All Members (Active, Retired, and Surviving Spouses)

- **Adoption Assistance:** Provides \$6,500 per child to help cover adoption-related expenses, including agency and attorney fees.
- **Emergency Assistance:** Offers one-time grants to address unforeseen financial emergencies. Groups affected by natural disasters may also qualify.
- **Transition-to-College Assistance:** Grants up to \$3,000 to eligible families for expenses related to a child's transition to college, such as purchasing a computer.

For Retirees and Surviving Spouses

- **Housing Supplements:** Ongoing financial support to help with housing costs, enabling retirees to remain in their homes or move to retirement facilities.
- **Income Supplements:** Provides monthly income support to retirees and surviving spouses who had modest earnings during their service.
- **Retiree Medical Grants:** Up to \$2,500 every three years to reimburse dental services and/or hearing aids for retirees, spouses, and surviving spouses aged 65 or older.

For Ministers in Active Service

- **Sabbath Sabbatical Support:** Grants up to \$10,000 to assist ministers in taking sabbaticals for personal and professional renewal.
- **Minister Educational Debt Assistance:** Provides up to \$25,000 to help ministers repay educational debt, along with access to debt coaching services.

Eligibility for these grants varies, and interested individuals are encouraged to review specific requirements for each program. For more information or to apply, visit the Board of Pensions' Assistance Program page: [pensions.org](https://pensions.org).

This is a reminder of the *Lifelong Learning educational programs* that are available for members. The Board of Pensions' Lifelong Learning program offers a comprehensive suite of educational resources designed to support the spiritual, health, financial, and vocational well-being of Benefits Plan members, their families, and affiliated employers. These offerings are tailored to accompany individuals through various stages of life and ministry, fostering holistic growth and resilience.

- **E-Learning:** Accessible, on-demand modules covering topics such as financial planning, clergy taxes, and vocational development. Notable series include Faithful Decision-Making, Personal Financial Planning, and Terms of Call. These resources are available in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, and Korean.
- **Webinars:** Monthly live sessions focusing on aspects of wholeness-spiritual, health, financial, and vocational. Participants enrolled in the Medical Plan can earn Call to Health points by attending.
- **Well-Being Wednesdays:** Quarterly virtual gatherings that provide a space for reflection and learning on wellness topics. Each session includes centering prayer, workshops, and discussions, aiming to rejuvenate participants' spirits. [pensions.org](https://www.pensions.org)
- **Well-Being Retreats:** Three-day in-person events offering rest and renewal, with activities designed to deepen participants' connection to their vocation and personal well-being.
- **Seminars:**
  - *THRIVE:* A holistic retirement planning seminar for those within ten years of retirement, addressing identity, vocation, and financial preparedness.
  - *First Call, First Steps:* Targeted at seminarians and candidates for ordination, this seminar covers practical aspects of entering ministry, including benefits and compensation.
  - *Third Act Seminar & Luncheon:* An annual event for retirees and surviving spouses, focusing on topics relevant to wholeness in retirement.
- *Education Resource Center:* A repository of materials on financial and retirement planning, as well as tax issues specific to ministers and congregations.
